FREE Chemical Users Course

The Northern Yarra Landcare Network is pleased to offer free courses in the use of farm chemicals such as those that are most effective against blackberry. These courses are available free to property owners in the fire-affected area.

Completion of a Chemical Users Course will mean you can...
Qualify for the Agricultural Chemical Users Permit (ACUP) from the Department of Primary Industries.
Learn about spray equipment and how to calibrate it correctly.
Understand how to interpret labels and use the right techniques.
Improve your preparation, storage and cleanup of chemicals.
Know the safety issues around the use of herbicides so you, your property, your neighbours and local wildlife will be safer.

Two courses are offered. Each course is run over 2 days.

Course 1 Day 1: Saturday 27th August Day 2: Saturday 3rd September Time: 9.00am – 3.00pm

Course 2 Day 1: Saturday 8th October Day 2: Saturday 15th October Time: 9.00am – 3.00pm

Favorable rainfall allowed a third tree planting to be held in Steels Creek in November, this time at the property of Ray and Sandra Turnley.

In total, about 1500 plants were planted across four Steels Creek properties last Spring.

Thanks to everybody involved in these events. Stay tuned for more planting days this coming Autumn.

Carolyn Suggate from **the Northern Yarra Blackberry Action Group** (NYBAG) is working with landholders in the northern reaches of Steels Creek to control blackberry. The NYBAG Steering Committee is made up of community members from the fire-affected area as well as reps from the different government agencies. NYBAG is a sub group of the new Northern Yarra Landcare Network, offering the use of spray equipment, rebates on the cost of chemical, safety wear and contractor spraying, as well as advice with mapping outbreaks and the coordination of blackberry control across property boundaries. So far, 17 properties in the north of Steels Creek have signed on to the voluntary program.

Parks Victoria have sprayed some of the boundaries they share with private owners and DSE will be tackling at least one area of Crown land that has been neglected for many years. For more information about the Blackberry Action Group, call Rob Fallon

Steels Creek Landcare Group, with the support of PP&W Catchment Management Authority and Melbourne Water has planned an Information Session aimed at exploring the issues around this question.

Northern Yarra Blackberry Action Group (NYBAG)

As the spray season draws to a close, Carolyn Suggate continues working with landholders in the northern reaches of Steels Creek to control blackberry. The NYBAG Steering Committee is made up of community members from the fire-affected area as well as reps from the different government agencies. NYBAG is a sub group of the Northern Yarra Landcare Network, offering the use of spray equipment, rebates on the cost of

chemical, safety-wear and contractor spraying, as well as advice with mapping outbreaks and the coordination of blackberry control across property boundaries.

NYBAG has signed up 28 properties to the north of Hunts Lane in Steels Creek and 17 in the north of Dixons Creek in its first year. Yarra Ranges Council contractors have sprayed the roadsides in these areas. Parks Victoria and DSE have applied for their own funding to assist with more spraying on the Kinglake National Park and State Forest boundaries, and VicRoads have made a commitment to spray the Melba Highway north of Pinnacle Lane. Melbourne Water is also following up with people on the Stream Frontage Management Program to help with creek infestations. We are hopeful that all agencies involved can carry through on their commitment to compliment action by landowners in our area.

An **Indian Myna Control Workshop** was held on Saturday 11 February at the Dixons Creek Reserve. The first hour was spent hearing about the behaviour and characteristics of this invasive species and guests then made their own traps using the materials provided or they bought one already made. More than 40 people attended, with 33 traps made or sold on the day. A further trap-making session is planned for later this year.

A **Rabbit Control Workshop** was held on Saturday 25 February at the Dixons Creek Reserve. Our 32 guests received expert advice and asked questions about the best techniques for rabbit control. A regional approach to rabbit control in the Steels Creek area could be the next big thing.

A **Native Grasses Information Night** was held on Wednesday 21 March at the Dixons Creek Reserve, with 45 people there to hear Dr Ian Chivers from NativeSeeds talk about the practicalities and benefits of native grasses for pasture, lawns, landscaping erosion control and inter-row planting in vineyards.

Coming up: stay tuned for more tree planting days this coming Autumn, provided the plants and owners are ready! We also hope to see the launch of the Dixons Creek Landcare Group. The combined efforts of Landcare Groups in both Steels Creek and Dixons Creek will definitely strengthen.

SCLG held a very successful ***Erosion Info Night*** recently with Dan Borg speaking about how hot bushfires decrease the soil's ability to absorb water. That has been a major cause of erosion in the fire affected area because of the heavy rains experienced immediately after the fires and the following months. Katie Drummond highlighted the improvements to Steels Creek that can be made when involved in a Stream Front program with Melbourne Water.

Andrew Grogan discussed possible erosion solutions in response to Q&A. And all in the spacious comfort of the SC Community Centre. We will be arranging to meet with those who volunteered their properties to check out possible erosion sites to highlight in forthcoming field days. We will advertise the dates when arrangements have been completed. Thank you to everyone who came.

The Reveg/Planting program on private land will be happening in early Spring. It is wonderful to see the plants growing above the tree guards from last year's planting.. And it is a great way to catch up with friends and neighbours or to make new friends when planting trees together. Dates will be posted closer to the planting season. Any one who has plants and need a hand to get them planted, please contact Sandra and we will add your property to the schedule.

The Northern Yarra Blackberry Action Group has recently been successful in receiving further funds to continue the wonderful work done this past blackberry season into the future. Thanks to those involved in writing the successful grant application on our behalf and to those Screekians who worked hard to remove blackberry infestations from their properties last season. Erosion follow-up:

Following up on the problems discussed at our recent Erosion info night and to assist with planning the next stage, we met with Kerry, an erosion expert from DPI and visited 3 properties in Steels Creek and Chum Creek. Dam wall stability, management of water through a dam, tunnel/rill erosion and slumping were looked at and possible solutions discussed.

Often the problem has occurred as a result of changes to the landscape by use of machinery, poor construction techniques or the amount of surface and underground water moving across the land. Some improvements can be simple to achieve whilst others involve a greater degree of works and money.

We are now planning for some more sessions to look at examples of common erosion people noted and seeing what expertise we can arrange to demonstrate positive measures/works for you to then try on your land. We will keep you informed on developments and when we will hold on-site activities.

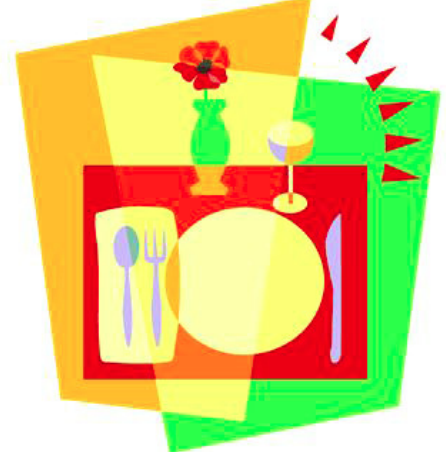

Congratulations to all the Screekians who are dealing with blackberries on their properties as part of the Blackberry Action Group program. This year's spraying and other eradication efforts are kicking off again over the summer season.

Rabbits

Noticed a rabbit or two around your place? Want to do something about getting rid of them? Like the Blackberries, we can best tackle the rabbit problem together.

The Landcare Group is planning a three pronged approach and would really like your help in making it work well. The Creek undertook a very successful rabbit baiting effort in the 2001 and we hope to do as well again. The first step will be an information session in December to outline the extent of the rabbit problem and how we can best deal with it. The second step will be to have a number of you committed people join us to co-ordinate the action in your local area. We will meet in January to assist co-ordinators to put a process in place. Working together, we can reduce rabbit numbers in each area and collectively, across the valley.

The last step will involve February being the rabbit busting month. We will run a practical workshop or field day to demonstrate the various rabbit reduction measures - baiting, harbour clearing and warren destruction, trapping and more.

We aim for as many as possible to all take some rabbit action during February. More details soon on the Grapevine.

RABBIT CONTROL FOR STEELS CREEK

Steels Creek Landcare Group encourages you to participate in a Rabbit Control Program in the coming 'Rabbit Season'.

Rabbits are one of Australia's most serious pest animals and typically:

- destroy pasture, crops and plant communities, impacting on agriculture and the environment;
- cause soil erosion and associated sedimentation of waterways;
- compete with native fauna for food and habitat; and
- are well suited to Australian conditions and breed prolifically.



HOW CAN WE SUCCESSFULLY REDUCE RABBIT NUMBERS?

1. Work together

Coordinate control work with your neighbours. The best results are achieved where neighbours conduct simultaneous rabbit control rather than just on individual properties.

2. Aim to be rabbit free

Create a detailed rabbit management plan for your property.

3. Conduct monitoring

Identify rabbit feeding and activity areas in and around your property. Map these areas for future reference. Rabbits are often found around waterways, weedy areas, rocky outcrops, buildings, wood heaps & fence lines.

4. Time of year

Rabbit control is most cost effective in late summer and early autumn as rabbit breeding has generally stopped.

5. Use all the tools!

Make your property a rabbit-hostile environment. Use all the available control measures that you need to - baiting, clearing of cover, trapping and warren destruction. Every individual rabbit should be exposed to as many different control measures as possible.

6. Size of the task

Put your best effort into the first year of your rabbit control program.

Remember - It is your responsibility to control rabbits on your property.

After SCLG's Rabbit Control meeting, the survey results will be used to plan practical demonstrations of rabbit control.

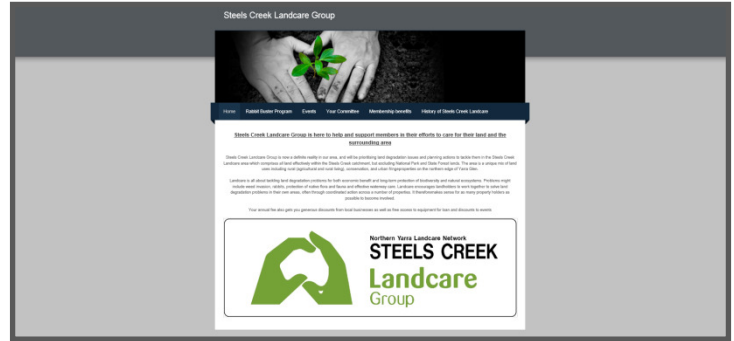

SCLG followed up its February Rabbit Control workshop with a practical demonstration of the rabbit baiting process in March at the Lloyd's property.

The day began with carving some baiting trails in known eating areas. Free feed oats were then laid into the furrows to attract rabbits. The poisoned bait oats will be laid out in the furrows with 3 feeds each a few days apart.

A bait station of wire netting was made to show an example of how to exclude native animals and non-target species from taking the bait. Burrows were smoked to locate connected exits. Harbour was explored to locate hidden burrows. The burrows were ripped and destroyed using a 5 tonne excavator.



The Landcare Group would like to encourage all readers to join us over the next 3 weeks in undertaking rabbit control baiting on your the properties. Working together in this time will really help reduce the rabbit numbers and their effect on our environment and landscape.

The Landcare group thanks the local traders who are supporting this initiative, in particular **Hoogies, Rural Fence & Trade Coldstream & CRC Excavations.**

Information on member discounts for Pindone, blackberry spray and fencing materials can be found on our website. Members purchasing pindone at RF&T during April will go into a draw for a solar electric fence energiser, generously donated by RF&T.

The landcare group's smoker is available for members to borrow and the group is purchasing some more equipment to assist members with fencing needs, including a motorised steel post driver and wire spinning and straining gear.



Steels Creek Landcare is delighted to now be able to supply a variety of equipment to its members for borrowing.

Rabbits- Following the start of our Rabbit Busting program, we are able to offer a smoker to check warrens prior to fumigation or ripping. It is hoped that with assistance, members will feel empowered to have an annual rabbit control program.

Fencing- We also now have a maxi driver to assist with fencing, this hand held driver weighs around 17 kg and is ideal for driving steels posts including larger ones. We decided to also purchase a netting strainer large enough for netting up to 1500mm wide and a 3 way wire spinner.



General gardening- there is a large list of pruners, weeding tools and planting equipment available to any members who want to borrow them, a full list is on our website at <http://www.steelscreeklandcare.org/>

Spraying- in addition to the 600 litre towable spray unit which is available through NYLN, we also have a smaller 200 litre unit, complete with 30m spray hose and boom spray, this unit (petrol driven) can be used from a quad bike, tractor or ute and is ideal for cape weed control & blackberry spraying in difficult access areas or even to dress your paddocks with a liquid fertiliser.

All equipment is free to borrow with a small (\$10) charge for fuel for petrol driven items - our intention is to add more equipment and are open to suggestions.



If you have not received your **membership card**, please email your postal details to Angie at steelscreeklandcare@gmail.com. You will need it to borrow equipment and when taking up member discount opportunities with local businesses.

On Monday 5th May a group of 37 students and 3 teachers from Billanook College braved the wet weather to assist with **weed control** of *Melaleuca armillaris* (listed on the Shire's Environmental Weed list) on the Maskiell's property in Steels Creek. After a short demonstration of the cut-stump method by Rob Fallon, the students worked tirelessly to clear the affected area. Thanks to the help of neighbour Keith Montell and his trusty ute, the students were able to carry all the cuttings to a central pile ready for burning. The day was part of the schools "Community Day Program" and it was a win-win situation for all involved. Billanook College is to be congratulated for the attitude, enthusiasm and work ethics of its students.
